#### What is this CRAAP?

- C Currency
- R Relevance
- A Authority
- A Accuracy
- P Purpose
- P Process

### Currency (Hey, things change!) Timeliness of the Information

- When was the information published or posted?
- Has the information been revised or updated?
- Is the information current or out-of-date for your topic?
- Are the links functional?

# Relevance (Why should I pick *you*?) Importance of the information for your needs

- Does the information relate to your topic or answer your question?
- Who is the intended audience?
- Is the information at an appropriate level (i.e. not too elementary or advanced for your needs)?
- Would you be comfortable using this source for a research paper?

## Authority (Yeah? Says who?!) Source of the Information

- Who is the author/publisher/source/sponsor?
  - Are the author's credentials or organizational affiliations given?
    - What are the author's qualifications to write on the topic?
- Does the URL (.com, .edu, .gov, etc.) reveal anything about the author or source?

## Accuracy (Pics or it didn't happen.) Reliability, truthfulness, and correctness

- Where does the information come from?
- Is the information supported by evidence?
- Has the information been reviewed or refereed?
- Can you verify any of the information in another source or from personal knowledge?
- Does the author omit important facts/data that may disprove a claim?
- Are there spelling, grammar, or other typographical errors?

#### Purpose (What's your point, dude?) Reason information exists

- What is the purpose of the information? to inform? teach? sell? entertain? persuade?
- Is the information fact? opinion? propaganda?
- Does the point of view appear objective and impartial?
- Are there political, ideological, cultural, religious, institutional, or personal biases?

## Process (How'd you do it, man?) Effort and steps behind creation and delivery

- How much reflection, research, or revising went into the process of creating the info?
  - Does that influence how you see that information?
- Does the final format match the author's purpose?
  - Tweets vs blogs vs press release vs newspaper editorial vs scholarly journal article?
