


From your very first day on campus, you'll find that Nichols College is a special place to be.

Above all, you will learn why you can anticipate success when you graduate with a Nichols College degree.







The Fischer Institute

The Robert C. Fischer Policy and Cultural institute offers students the opportunity to extend their intellectual and cultural experience beyond the classroom. Through the Fischer Institute, students will attend a variety of programs designed to help them gain insight and perspective on a broad range of topics. Ultimately, the intent of this program is to enhance the learning environment, and encourage exploration of diverse cultural activities they may not have otherwise considered.

Honors Scholar Program This program is designed to identify and develop outstanding academic achievement. Honors students may select honors courses from across the curriculum, work with professors on projects in their chosen area of study, and receive appropriate recognition at graduation.

Three-year BSBA program: Qualified students are now able to complete their Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with a concentration in General Business in only three years! Students enrolled in the program will be able to take an expanded schedule during each semester and complete online or intercession courses outside of the traditional schedule. It is a unique opportunity to complete your degree while saving time and tuition dollars.

This program consists of four onesemester courses during which you will consider, develop, and refine your personal and professional career goals. In addition, you will learn communication styles, job search strategies, how to network, and even diving efiquette.


Here's what is included in the PDS program:


YEAR 4: Draw on all your experiences to begin to market

The following distance learning options are available to third- and fourth-year students:

European University Semester Abroad Spend a semester at one of European University's campuses in Spain, Switzerland, Turkey, Germany or Singapore, Additional options are available through API International in Spain, Italy or France.

Regents College Semester Abroad Spend a semester abroad studying in the heart of London, England. All coursework completed at Regents will be transferred back to Nichols.

The Washington Center Internship
Students participate in a nationally recognized academic program in Washington, D.C. The Washington Center has partnered with a vast array of businesses, government agencies, and nonprofit organizations to ensure that students gain top flight industry experience during their time in the program

The Washington, D.C.—London
Summer Internship This program
consists of a ten-day seminar in

eight week summer internship in
London, Students will be placed

Semester at Sea Study aboard an ocean liner through a program that combines practical experience with educational opportunities. Students who participate will see up to 15 global ports during their time on board.

Annual Spring Trip Each year the Nichols community offers trips abroad, Recent destinations have included Amsterdam, China, Italy, Greece, London, Paris and South Africa, and future trips are scheduled for Ireland and Brazil. Students that participate in these trips can earn cultural credits through the Fischer Institute that help fulfill their graduation requirements.

Earn a dual degree from Nichols and from European University!

After successfully completing their first two years at Nichols College, our students are eligible to spend their junior year abroad. Students will take classes at participating European University's (EU) sites including Barcelona, Geneva, Munich and Singapore. The program allows students to spend two semesters at the same campus or attend two different EU campuses while completing their coursework. All credits earned at EU will transfer back to Nichols, and upon graduation, you will receive a BSBA from Nichols and a BBA from European University.








Directions to NICHOLS COLLEGE

From the north

Take I-290 to Auburn, where I-290 becomes I-395 South.* Follow to Exit 4B (Sutton Road/Oxford center.) Turn right off ramp and stay in the right lane. Go straight through the light at Oxford center (Cumberland Farms on right). Follow straight past light for 0.8 miles and take a left onto Dudley Road. Follow this road for 3.7 miles, staying straight through a four-way stop sign. Dudley Road becomes Dudley/Oxford Road at the town line. Bearing right at the fork (pond on your right), continue on Dudley/Oxford Road for 2 miles through two stop signs, then straight onto the Nichols campus.

From the east and west

Take the Mass Pike to Exit 10 in Auburn, and then onto 1-395 South. Follow directions from above.*

From Providence

Take 146 North to Route 16 West heading toward Douglas/Webster, Massachusetts. Follow Route 16 into-Webster. (Do not exit onto I-395 South.) See below for directions "From the south" and resume directions from the second line: "Go straight through the first set of traffic lights."

From the south

Take I-95 North to I-395 North to Exit 2, (Webster) and turn left off the ramp. Go straight through the first set of traffic lights. Follow Route 12 South. (Route 12 will turn left through Webster center.) Continue through Webster center. After the railroad tracks, continue straight into Dudley. At the second set of lights after the railroad tracks, stay in the right lane. (Route 12 will bear off to the left, but go straight onto Route 197.) Route 197 is also West Main Street in Dudley. Stay on West Main Street (Route 197) until you reach a set of lights next to Cumberland Farms/gas station. Turn right directly after Cumberland Farms onto Airport Road. Follow Airport Road and bear right at the Dudley Hill Golf Club. Take the first left onto Center Road and proceed directly onto the Nichols campus.

From Hartford, CT

Take I-84 East towards Boston, Take Exit 2 (Sturbridge/Southbridge). When on exit ramp, keep right at the fork. Turn left onto Haynes Street. Turn right onto MA-131/Main Street. Proceed to rotary in Southbridge and take the first right onto MA-131. Follow MA-131 through Dudley, Massachusetts, then briefly pass through Thompson, Connecticut. At the lights in Connecticut, bear left onto Route 197. You will re-enter Dudley, Massachusetts on Route 197. Turn left onto Center Road, Follow Center Road up the hill to the Nichols College compus.
