Approximately 50% of course work in business administration is in the liberal arts areas. After beginning with course "threads" including communications, quantitative studies and behavioral studies, Nichols' acclaimed business administration curriculum will then focus you on a specific area of business study.

In the sophomore or junior year you will choose your area of specialization from one of the following:

Students have a variety of choices in living environments. Residence halfs accommodate 40 to 250 students; Shamie Hall, our newest residence, is the largest. Several houses located on or near campus accommodate 10–20 students, encouraging smaller, family-like communities. Professional Residence Directors and student Resident Assistants guide all resident activities and serve as friends and mentors. Students govern residences through elected Half Councils which support half and house policies and social events. You may be interested in one of our Wellness Houses where students voluntarily abstain from using tobacco and alcohol.

The campus possesses New England's classic restful beauty. But don't worry about over-relaxing — there's plenty going on here and all around to keep you active. Within short drives of our central location are the beaches of Cape Cod, the ski resorts of southern Vermont and the endless cultural and recreational possibilities of Boston, Hartford and Providence. New York City is also within driving distance. Nichols students are allowed cars on campus, so off-campus interests are even more accessible.


Nichols is an impressive blend of old and new. We've transformed 19th century buildings and retooled them to help you take on the challenges of the 21st century. Several modern facilities complement the traditional setting. In all, the College occupies 42 buildings.

Shamie Hall, the largest and most modern residence hall on campus, has common lounge areas and study rooms, individually controlled heat and air conditioning, private bathrooms and cable TV/computer hookups. Conant Library houses an extensive audio-visual center and Learning Resources Center. Davis Information Center is the focal point of Nichols' computer resources, featuring networked microcomputers and printers. Davis Hall is a state-of-the-art academic center including 10 classrooms with student computer stations linked to the campus electronic network, a seminar room, faculty office and a lounge area. Chalmers Field House, with a basketball court, training rooms, workout room, sauna and swimming pool, is the center of athletic activities on campus. The Outdoor Recreation Center's powerful lighting allows you to enjoy six tennis courts, basketball courts and a volleyball pit into the evening hours.








STUDENT-ATHLETES. We are a small college with "big" college varsity sports such as football, basketball, ice hockey, soccer and softball, Games are major social and athletic events for athletes, students and faculty alike. Athletics are enormously popular among the student body and participation is wide-spread. Between one-third and one-half of the student body play a varsity sport. Nichols offers 15 varsity sports for women and men in Division III.

Athletics are taken seriously within the context of a small college learning environment. Nichols' athletes have a chance to learn about leadership, tearnwork, striving for excellence, facing adversity and the importance of competition — key lessons carrying over to the workplace and to life. Nichols encourages those interested in playing more than one varsity sport, a rare opportunity even at the Division III level.


Freshman Seminar — More than just an extended orientation, this comprehensive, innovative program is required of all new students. Taught by faculty, administrators and peer teaching assistants, first-semester material focuses on the transition into college, study skills and life skills. Topics include career planning, holistic health, relationships, tolerance and substance abuse. Spring semester features a choice between reading development and critical thinking courses presented by the Director of Advising Services.

The Career Services Office — As part of the Freshman Seminar you'll begin to explore your career options through the computerized "Discover" program focusing on your particular interests, skills and values. Throughout your four years you can access other services including individual counseling, resume critiques, interviewing support, workshops to aid the work search, on-campus interviewing, inclusion in an electronic resume database distributed to area employers, an annual Career Day and our career library resources.

Internship Programs — The College offers local area internships with business, government and nonprofit organizations. Students and faculty arrange sites in cooperation with an internship sponsor.

Health Services — Nichols operates an outpatient clinic on campus at the Merrill Infirmary. It is staffed by a full-time registered nurse and a physician in attendance daily. Three therapists provide psychological and substance abuse counseling services in the infirmary.

Campus Ministry — Although Nichols is a nonsectarian, private institution, we encourage the moral and spiritual growth of our students. Our College Chaplain resides here and has an official nondenominational role working closely with clergy of all religious traditions to serve students' needs.




CULTURAL OPPORTUNITIES / EVENTS


FINANCIAL AID — AN INNOVATIVE MERIT-BASED PROGRAM

The Nichols College Merit-Based Scholarship and Grant Program rewards incoming freshmen for high school academic achievement and transfer students for transferable college credit. Awards are renewable each year as long as a minimum GPA is maintained.

Nichols participates in the following Title IV Federal student assistance programs: Federal Pell Grant Program, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Federal Work Study Program (FWS) and the Federal Stafford Loan Program.

Other sources of financial assistance include Federal Parent Loans for Undergraduate Students (PLUS), Federal Unsubsidized Stafford Loan (formerly SLS), Financial Assistance for Massachusetts Students, Massachusetts State Scholarship Program, Gilbert Grants, Massachusetts No-Interest Loan Program.


- 1) Official records of SAT or ACT scores
